Jesus seems to show partiality in his first response to the Syrophoenician woman in today's gospel. Was he testing her faith in saying Gentiles don't deserve the goods meant for God's children? The story tells us that God shows no partiality. Everyone who brings a need to Jesus is received with equal honor as a child and heir.

FIRST LESSON

Isaiah 35:4-7a

Isaiah is full of hope: God vindicates injustice, heals disease, and reverses drought.

⁴Say to the cowardly:

“Be strong; do not fear!

Here is your God; vengeance is coming.

God’s retribution is coming; he will save you.”

⁵Then the eyes of the blind will be opened,
and the ears of the deaf unstopped.

⁶Then the lame will leap like a deer,
and the tongue of the mute will sing for joy,
for water will gush in the wilderness,
and streams in the desert;

⁷the parched ground will become a pool,
and the thirsty land, springs.

In the haunt of jackals, in their lairs,
there will be grass, reeds, and papyrus.

PSALM OF THE DAY

Psalms 146/ CW p. 120

SECOND LESSON

James 2:1-18

James instructs us not to show favoritism. But to treat the poor as we do Christ himself, who became poor for us.

2 My brothers and sisters, do not show favoritism as you hold on to the faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ. ²For if someone comes into your meeting wearing a gold ring and dressed in fine clothes, and a poor person dressed in filthy clothes also comes in, ³if you look with favor on the one wearing the fine clothes and say, “Sit here in a good

place,” and yet you say to the poor person, “Stand over there,” or “Sit here on the floor by my footstool,” ⁴ haven’t you made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts?

⁵ Listen, my dear brothers and sisters: Didn’t God choose the poor in this world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom that he has promised to those who love him? ⁶ Yet you have dishonored the poor. Don’t the rich oppress you and drag you into court? ⁷ Don’t they blaspheme the good name that was invoked over you?

⁸ Indeed, if you fulfill the royal law prescribed in the Scripture, **Love your neighbor as yourself**,^[a] you are doing well. ⁹ If, however, you show favoritism, you commit sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. ¹⁰ For whoever keeps the entire law, and yet stumbles at one point, is guilty of breaking it all. ¹¹ For he who said, **Do not commit adultery**,^[a] also said, **Do not murder**.^[a] So if you do not commit adultery, but you murder, you are a lawbreaker.

¹² Speak and act as those who are to be judged by the law of freedom. ¹³ For judgment is without mercy to the one who has not shown mercy. Mercy triumphs over judgment.

¹⁴ What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but does not have works? Can such faith save him?

¹⁵ If a brother or sister is without clothes and lacks daily food ¹⁶ and one of you says to them, “Go in peace, stay warm, and be well fed,” but you don’t give them what the body needs, what good is it? ¹⁷ In the same way faith, if it does not have works, is dead by itself.

¹⁸ But someone will say, “You have faith, and I have works.”^[a] Show me your faith without works, and I will show you faith by my works.

THE GOSPEL

Mark 7:24-37

What does religion look like when it doesn't affect the heart? This. After correcting outward washings, getting to the heart of the matter, his disciples need further instruction. He has done everything well.

²⁴ He got up and departed from there to the region of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know it, but he could not escape notice. ²⁵ Instead, immediately after hearing about him, a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit came and fell at his feet. ²⁶ The woman was a Gentile, a Syrophenician by birth, and she was asking him to cast the demon out of her daughter. ²⁷ He said to her, “Let the children be fed first, because it isn’t right to take the children’s bread and throw it to the dogs.”

²⁸ But she replied to him, “Lord, even the dogs under the table eat the children’s crumbs.”

²⁹ Then he told her, “Because of this reply, you may go. The demon has left your daughter.” ³⁰ When she went back to her home, she found her child lying on the bed, and the demon was gone.

³¹ Again, leaving the region of Tyre, he went by way of Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, through the region of the Decapolis. ³² They brought to him a deaf man who had difficulty speaking and begged Jesus to lay his hand on him. ³³ So he took him away from the crowd in private. After putting his fingers in the man’s ears and spitting, he touched his tongue. ³⁴ Looking up to heaven, he sighed deeply and said to him, “Ephphatha!” (that is, “Be opened!”). ³⁵ Immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was loosened, and he began to speak clearly. ³⁶ He ordered them to tell no one, but the more he ordered them, the more they proclaimed it.

³⁷ They were extremely astonished and said, “He has done everything well. He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak.”

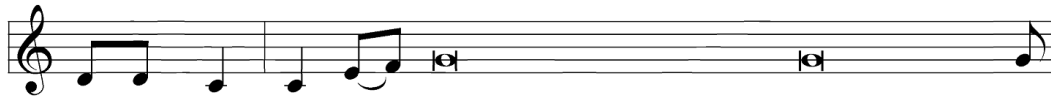
