WORSHIP THEME

Those who labor in his vineyard depict the wide diversity of vocations to which disciples are called. We are called to live and serve by faith in his promises. 



PRAYER OF THE DAY

SECOND LESSON

Philippians 1:12–14, 19–30

Paul was in prison because he is a Christian. In life or death Paul can serve Christ. God's grace leads Paul to serve and see death as gain.

¹²Now I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that what has happened to me has actually advanced the gospel, ¹³ so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial guard, and to everyone else, that my imprisonment is because I am in Christ. ¹⁴Most of the brothers have gained confidence in the Lord from my imprisonment and dare even more to speak the word^[a] fearlessly.

¹⁹because I know this will lead to my salvation^[a] through your prayers and help from the Spirit of Jesus Christ. ²⁰My eager expectation and hope is that I will not be ashamed about anything, but that now as always, with all courage, Christ will be highly honored in my body, whether by life or by death.

²¹For me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. ²²Now if I live on in the flesh, this means fruitful work for me; and I don't know which one I should choose. ²³I am torn between the two. I long to depart and be with Christ—which is far better—²⁴ but to remain in the flesh is more necessary for your sake. ²⁵Since I am persuaded of this, I know that I will remain and continue with all of you for your progress and joy in the faith, ²⁶ so that, because of my coming to you again, your boasting in Christ Jesus may abound.

²⁷ Just one thing: As citizens of heaven, live your life worthy of the gospel of Christ. Then, whether I come and see you or am absent, I will hear about you that you are standing firm in one spirit, in one accord,^[a] contending together for the faith of the gospel,²⁸ not being frightened in any way by your opponents. This is a sign of destruction for them, but of your salvation—and this is from God.²⁹ For it has been granted to you on Christ’s behalf not only to believe in him, but also to suffer for him,³⁰ since you are engaged in the same struggle that you saw I had and now hear that I have.

THE GOSPEL

Matthew 20:1–16

God calls us to serve him. Not everyone has the same work but by grace we have been called to serve in his vineyard.

20 “For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire workers for his vineyard. ² After agreeing with the workers on one denarius,^[a] he sent them into his vineyard for the day. ³ When he went out about nine in the morning,^[a] he saw others standing in the marketplace doing nothing. ⁴ He said to them, ‘You also go into my vineyard, and I’ll give you whatever is right.’ So off they went. ⁵ About noon and about three,^[a] he went out again and did the same thing. ⁶ Then about five^[a] he went and found others standing around^[a] and said to them, ‘Why have you been standing here all day doing nothing?’

⁷ “‘Because no one hired us,’ they said to him.

“You also go into my vineyard,’ he told them.^[4] ⁸ When evening came, the owner of the vineyard told his foreman, ‘Call the workers and give them their pay, starting with the last and ending with the first.’

⁹ “When those who were hired about five came, they each received one denarius. ¹⁰ So when the first ones came, they assumed they would get more, but they also received a denarius each. ¹¹ When they received it, they began to complain to the landowner: ¹² “These last men put in one hour, and you made them equal to us who bore the burden of the day’s work and the burning heat.’

¹³ “He replied to one of them, ‘Friend, I’m doing you no wrong. Didn’t you agree with me on a denarius?’ ¹⁴ Take what’s yours and go. I want to give this last man the same as I gave you. ¹⁵ Don’t I have the right to do what I want with what is mine? Are you jealous^[4] because I’m generous?’^[4]

¹⁶ “So the last will be first, and the first last.”^[4]

This greeting marks a new service, so to speak. These ancient introductory words & phrases help to highlight, celebrate and bring attention to the Sacrament.

Therefore, with all the saints on earth and hosts of heaven, we praise your holy name and join their glorious song:

HOLY, HOLY, HOLY – *Sanctus*³

³ *Sanctus* means “holy.” Used as early as the second century, this canticle was in wide use among Christians by the fourteenth century.


