WORSHIP THEME

Look at all the problems and all the obstacles to following the call of Jesus. Everybody in town seemed to have trouble or sickness or demon possession. Even the mother-in-law of Peter was down sick with a fever that prevented her from hearing the Word and from serving her divine Guest. But each and every one of the problems and hindrances was a blessing in disguise. For each one of them gave people a reason to despair of their own abilities and to seek in Jesus the compassionate and merciful Savior. It is very useful for us to put our own problems and hindrances to following Jesus in this perspective: trials spur us to seek his help; his help should spur us to service. Jesus' eyes were always and at the same time in two directions: down to rescue and to save us in our need, and up to do it all as an act of worship and obedience to his Father. He prayed. Then he went on to proclaim the gospel and continue his work of casting out the devil.

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON

Isaiah 40:21-31

Israel has an incomparable God who watches over her. God is not unaware of our situation or suffering but he promises to act and to save for he is the one who gives strength.

²¹Do you not know? Have you not heard? Has it not been declared to you from the beginning? Have you not considered the foundations of the earth? ²²God is enthroned above the circle of the earth; its inhabitants are like grasshoppers. He stretches out the heavens like thin cloth and spreads them out like a tent to live in. ²³He reduces princes to nothing and makes judges of the earth like a wasteland. ²⁴ They are barely planted, barely sown, their stem hardly takes root in the ground when he blows on them and they wither, and a whirlwind carries them away like stubble. ²⁵ "To whom will you compare me, or who is my equal?" asks the Holy One. ²⁶Look up and see! Who created these? He brings out the stars by number;

he calls all of them by name. Because of his great power and strength, not one of them is missing.

²⁷ Jacob, why do you say, and Israel, why do you assert, "My way is hidden from the LORD, and my claim is ignored by my God"? ²⁸ Do you not know? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the whole earth. He never becomes faint or weary; there is no limit to his understanding. ²⁹He gives strength to the faint and strengthens the powerless. ³⁰Youths may become faint and weary, and young men stumble and fall, ³¹ but those who trust in the LORD will renew their strength; they will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not become weary, they will walk and not faint.

SECOND LESSON

1 Corinthians 9:16-27

Paul filled with compassion for others shared the gospel in a way so as to save. He didn't join with sinners in their sin but he preached to them to gospel of a gracious and compassionate God who saves sinners.

¹⁶ For if I preach the gospel, I have no reason to boast, because I am compelled to preach—and woe to me if I do not preach the gospel! ¹⁷ For if I do this willingly, I have a reward, but if unwillingly, I am entrusted with a commission. ¹⁸ What then is my

reward? To preach the gospel and offer it free of charge and not make full use of my rights in the gospel.

¹⁹ Although I am free from all and not anyone's slave, I have made myself a slave to everyone, in order to win more people. ²⁰ To the Jews I became like a Jew, to win Jews; to those under the law, like one under the law—though I myself am not under the law—to win those under the law. ²¹ To those who are without the law, like one without the law—though I am not without God's law but under the law of Christ—to win those without the law. ²² To the weak I became weak, in order to win the weak. I have become all things to all people, so that I may by every possible means save some. ²³ Now I do all this because of the gospel, so that I may share in the blessings.

²⁴ Don't you know that the runners in a stadium all race, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way to win the prize. ²⁵ Now everyone who competes exercises self-control in everything. They do it to receive a perishable crown, but we an imperishable crown. ²⁶ So I do not run like one who runs aimlessly or box like one beating the air. ²⁷ Instead, I discipline my body and bring it under strict control, so that after preaching to others, I myself will not be disqualified.

THE GOSPEL

Mark 1:29-39

Given the endless series of things to which Jesus attends, we sometimes imagine that he is too busy for us and our problems. But Jesus knows and cares for each of us individually. He actually commands us to lay all our needs before him and stands ever-willing and able to help us.



²⁹ As soon as they left the synagogue, they went into Simon and Andrew's house with James and John. ³⁰ Simon's mother-in-law was lying in bed with a fever, and they told him about her at once. ³¹ So he went to her, took her by the hand, and raised her up. The fever left her,^[4] and she began to serve them.

³²When evening came, after the sun had set, they brought to him all those who were sick and demon-possessed. ³³The whole town was assembled at the door, ³⁴ and he healed many who were sick with various diseases and drove out many demons. And he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him.

³⁵ Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, he got up, went out, and made his way to a deserted place; and there he was praying. ³⁶ Simon and his companions searched for him, ³⁷ and when they found him they said, "Everyone is looking for you."

³⁸ And he said to them, "Let's go on to the neighboring villages so that I may preach there too. This is why I have come."

³⁹He went into all of Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and driving out demons.
