Likewise, in the Gospel, Jesus comes to His hometown to teach, but He is rejected. And in the Epistle, we find the theme in its clearest depiction as Paul boasts and rejoices in his weakness, because when he is weak, then he is strong, and God most clearly showcases His power, grace, and mercy.


INVOCATION

THE WORD

FIRST LESSON

Ezekiel 2:1-5

In 597 BC, the priest Ezekiel was removed into exile in Babylon. While there, he is sent to serve as a prophet to a people who are unwilling to listen.

He said to me, "Son of man, stand up on your feet and I will speak with you." ² As he spoke to me, the Spirit entered me and set me on my feet, and I listened to the one who was speaking to me. ³ He said to me, "Son of man, I am sending you to the Israelites, to^[a] the rebellious pagans who have rebelled against me. The Israelites and their ancestors have transgressed against me to this day. ⁴ The descendants are obstinate^[b] and hardhearted. I am sending you to them, and you must say to them, "This is what the Lord GOD says.' ⁵ Whether they listen or refuse to listen—for they are a rebellious house—they will know that a prophet has been among them.

PSALM OF THE DAY SECOND LESSON

Psalm 143 / CW p. 118

2 Corinthians 12:1-10

Christians do not boast of their own accomplishments. Rather, Christian boasting focuses attention on how the power of Christ is present in our lives, especially in times of weakness and vulnerability. No matter what our circumstances in life, Christ's grace is sufficient for us.

Boasting is necessary. It is not profitable, but I will move on to visions and revelations of the Lord. ²I know a man in Christ who was caught up to the third heaven fourteen years ago. Whether he was in the body or out of the body, I don't know; God knows. ³I know that this man—whether in the body or out of the body I don't know; God knows—⁴ was caught up into paradise and heard inexpressible words, which a human being is not allowed to speak. ⁵I will boast about this person, but not about myself, except of my weaknesses.

⁶ For if I want to boast, I wouldn't be a fool, because I would be telling the truth. But I will spare you, so that no one can credit me with something beyond what he sees in me or hears from me, ⁷ especially because of the extraordinary revelations. Therefore, so that I would not exalt myself, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, a messenger of Satan to torment me so that I would not exalt myself. ⁸ Concerning this, I pleaded with the Lord three times that it would leave me. ⁹ But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is perfected in weakness."

Therefore, I will most gladly boast all the more about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may reside in me. ¹⁰ So I take pleasure in weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and in difficulties, for the sake of Christ. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

THE GOSPEL

Mark 6:1-13

Jesus is rejected in His hometown but sends out the twelve disciples to proclaim repentance, cast out demons, and heal the sick



C: Glo-ry be to you, O Lord!

He left there and came to his hometown, and his disciples followed him. ²When the Sabbath came, he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astonished. "Where did this man get these things?" they said. "What is this wisdom that has been given to him, and how are these miracles performed by his hands? ³Isn't this the carpenter, the son of Mary, and the brother of James, Joses, Judas, and Simon? And aren't his sisters here with us?" So they were offended by him.

⁴Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor except in his hometown, among his relatives, and in his household." ⁵He was not able to do a miracle there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and healed them. ⁶And he was amazed at their unbelief. He was going around the villages teaching.

⁷He summoned the Twelve and began to send them out in pairs and gave them authority over unclean spirits. ⁸He instructed them to take nothing for the road except a staff—no bread, no traveling bag, no money in their belts, ⁹ but to wear sandals and not put on an extra shirt. ¹⁰He said to them, "Whenever you enter a house, stay there until you leave that place. ¹¹If any place does not welcome you or listen to you, when you leave there, shake the dust off your feet as a testimony against them."^[4] ¹²So they went out and preached that people should repent. ¹³They drove out many demons, anointed many sick people with oil and healed them.

NICENE CREED


Stand


PREFACE

Therefore, with all the saints on earth and hosts of heaven, we praise your holy name and join their glorious song:




DISTRIBUTION
