WORSHIP THEME

Those who labor in his vineyard depict the wide diversity of vocations to which disciples are called. We are called to live and serve by faith in his promises. In mercy he has chosen to bear "The burden of the heat of the day," on our behalf. The way of the LORD is foolish to the world and foreign to our way of thinking. But he draws near, so that he may be found, have compassion, and pardon. Whether in life or death we serve the LORD.

What is our God like? The next Sundays the Church hears Jesus tell four parables that reveal characteristics of our God. Today's lessons cause us to ask: Is God fair? No, he's not. He doesn't give us what we deserve, and that's called mercy. In fact, he gives us what we don't deserve, and that's called grace.



CONFESSION OF SINS

M: Beloved in the Lord: let us draw near with a true heart and confess our sins to God our Father, asking him in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to grant us forgiveness.

C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful, and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words, and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

LORD, HAVE MERCY – Kyrie²



¹ We are standing in the presence of God—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—in whose name we have been baptized.

² Having entered God's presence, the Kyrie (Latin for 'Lord") serves as our earnest plea for his grace and peace.

M: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son # and of the Holy Spirit.

The Service of the Word

Having just received absolution for their sins, believers now gather around the Word of God to find encouragement and peace for their lives on earth.



PRAYER OF THE DAY

The Collect (also known as the "Prayer of the Day") is a concise prayer which "collects" the thoughts of the day and presents them to God in his mercy. Many of these prayers have been in use in the church for more than 1,500 years.

M: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

M: Let us pray.

Lord God, you call us to work in your kingdom and leave no one standing idle. Help us to order our lives by your wisdom and to serve you in willing obedience; through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

C: Amen

FIRST LESSON Isaiah 55:6–9

His thoughts are higher than our thoughts. His plan for the salvation of sinners is by grace alone. While there is time, seek the LORD while he may be found.

⁶ Seek the LORD while he may be found; call to him while he is near.

⁷ Let the wicked one abandon his way and the sinful one his thoughts; let him return to the LORD, so he may have compassion on him, and to our God, for he will freely forgive.

SECOND LESSON

Philippians 1:12–14, 19–30

Paul was in prison because he is a Christian. In life or death Paul can serve Christ. God's grace leads Paul to serve and see death as gain.

¹² Now I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that what has happened to me has actually advanced the gospel, ¹³ so that it has become known throughout the whole imperial guard, and to everyone else, that my imprisonment is because I am in Christ. ¹⁴ Most of the brothers have gained confidence in the Lord from my imprisonment and dare even more to speak the word^[a] fearlessly.

¹⁹ because I know this will lead to my salvation^[a] through your prayers and help from the Spirit of Jesus Christ. ²⁰ My eager expectation and hope is that I will not be ashamed about anything, but that now as always, with all courage, Christ will be highly honored in my body, whether by life or by death.

²¹ For me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. ²² Now if I live on in the flesh, this means fruitful work for me; and I don't know which one I should choose. ²³ I am torn between the two. I long to depart and be with Christ—which is far better— ²⁴ but to remain in the flesh is more necessary for your sake. ²⁵ Since I am persuaded of this, I know that I will remain and continue with all of you for your progress and joy in the faith, ²⁶ so that, because of my coming to you again, your boasting in Christ Jesus may abound.

²⁷ Just one thing: As citizens of heaven, live your life worthy of the gospel of Christ. Then, whether I come and see you or am absent, I will hear about you that you are standing firm in one spirit, in one accord, ^[5] contending together for the faith of the gospel, ²⁸ not being frightened in any way by your opponents. This is a sign of destruction for them, but of your salvation—and this is from God. ²⁹ For it has been granted to you on Christ's behalf not only to believe in him, but also to suffer for him, ³⁰ since you are engaged in the same struggle that you saw I had and now hear that I have.

THE GOSPEL Matthew 20:1–16

God calls us to serve him. Not everyone has the same work but by grace we have been called to serve in his vineyard.



20 "For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire workers for his vineyard. ² After agreeing with the workers on one denarius, ^[a] he sent them into his vineyard for the day. ³ When he went out about nine in the morning, ^[b] he saw others standing in the marketplace doing nothing. ⁴ He said to them, 'You also go into my vineyard, and I'll give you whatever is right.' So off they went. ⁵ About noon and about three, ^[c] he went out again and did the same thing. ⁶ Then about five ^[d] he went and found others standing around ^[e] and said to them, 'Why have you been standing here all day doing nothing?'

7 "Because no one hired us,' they said to him.


"You also go into my vineyard,' he told them. [1] 8 When evening came, the owner of the vineyard told his foreman, 'Call the workers and give them their pay, starting with the last and ending with the first.'

⁹ "When those who were hired about five came, they each received one denarius. ¹⁰ So when the first ones came, they assumed they would get more, but they also received a denarius each. ¹¹ When they received it, they began to complain to the landowner: ¹² "These last men put in one hour, and you made them equal to us who bore the burden of the day's work and the burning heat.'

13 "He replied to one of them, 'Friend, I'm doing you no wrong. Didn't you agree with me on a denarius? 14 Take what's yours and go. I want to give this last man the same as I gave you. 15 Don't I have the right to do what I want with what is mine? Are you jealous because I'm generous? 16

16 "So the last will be first, and the first last." []



Give us strength to face the evils of each day with fresh confidence. Open our lips to speak of Your grace and move us to use the gifts that You give us to share Your Word of salvation with all people. Protect and prosper the family, the school, the government and all good institutions that You have established for the benefit of society. Remember in mercy those who are sick and suffering and bring Your healing to troubled homes and lives.

C: Move us to pray for those in need and to help them with deeds of kindness. Special prayers and intercessions may follow.

This greeting marks a new service, so to speak. These ancient introductory words & phrases help to highlight, celebrate and bring attention to the Sacrament.

PREFACE

M: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

M: Lift up your hearts.

C: We lift them up to the Lord.

M: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

C: It is good and right so to do.

M: It is truly good and right that we should at all times and in all places give you thanks, O Lord, holy father, almighty and everlasting God, through Jesus Christ, our Lord,

who promised that wherever two or three come together in his name, there he is with them to shepherd his flock till he comes again in glory.

Therefore, with all the saints on earth and hosts of heaven, we praise your holy name and join their glorious song:

HOLY, HOLY, HOLY – Sanctus³

³ Sanctus means "holy." Used as early as the second century, this canticle was in wide use among Christians by the fourteenth century.



WORDS OF INSTITUTION - The Words of institution both proclaim the words of Jesus to the congregation and sets apart the bread and wine for the Lord's Supper.




DISTRIBUTION
