## THE WORD

### FIRST LESSON

*Genesis 15:1-6*

*In faith, Abram treasured all the LORD's gracious promises.*

After these events, the word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision:

Do not be afraid, Abram.

I am your shield;

your reward will be very great.

<sup>2</sup> But Abram said, "Lord GOD, what can you give me, since I am childless and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" <sup>3</sup> Abram continued, "Look, you have given me no offspring, so a slave born in<sup>1</sup> my house will be my heir."

<sup>4</sup> Now the word of the LORD came to him: "This one will not be your heir; instead, one who comes from your own body<sup>2</sup> will be your heir." <sup>5</sup> He took him outside and said, "Look at the sky and count the stars, if you are able to count them." Then he said to him, "Your offspring will be that numerous."

<sup>6</sup> Abram believed the LORD, and he credited it to him as righteousness.

## PSALM OF THE DAY

*Psalms 121*

### SECOND LESSON

*Hebrews 11:1-16*

*The gift of faith allows us to see that treasure that is found in the city whose architect and builder is God.*

Now faith is the reality<sup>1</sup> of what is hoped for, the proof<sup>2</sup> of what is not seen. <sup>2</sup> For by this our ancestors were approved.

<sup>3</sup> By faith we understand that the universe was<sup>3</sup> created by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.<sup>4</sup>

<sup>4</sup> By faith Abel offered to God a better sacrifice than Cain did. By faith he was approved as a righteous man, because God approved his gifts, and even though he is dead, he still speaks through his faith.

<sup>5</sup> By faith Enoch was taken away, and so he did not experience death. **He was not to be found because God took him away.** <sup>6</sup> For before he was taken away, he was approved as one who pleased God. <sup>6</sup> Now without faith it is impossible to please God, since the one who draws near to him must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him.

<sup>7</sup> By faith Noah, after he was warned about what was not yet seen and motivated by godly fear, built an ark to deliver his family. By faith he condemned the world and became an heir of the righteousness that comes by faith.

<sup>8</sup> By faith Abraham, when he was called, obeyed and set out for a place that he was going to receive as an inheritance. He went out, even though he did not know where he was going. <sup>9</sup> By faith he stayed as a foreigner in the land of promise, living in tents as did Isaac and Jacob, coheirs of the same promise. <sup>10</sup> For he was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God.

<sup>11</sup> By faith even Sarah herself, when she was unable to have children, received power to conceive offspring, even though she was past the age, since she <sup>11</sup> considered that the one who had promised was faithful. <sup>12</sup> Therefore, from one man—in fact, from one as good as dead—came offspring as numerous as the stars of the sky and as innumerable as the grains of sand along the seashore.

<sup>13</sup> These all died in faith, although they had not received the things that were promised. But they saw them from a distance, greeted them, and confessed that they were foreigners and temporary residents on the earth. <sup>14</sup> Now those who say such things make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. <sup>15</sup> If they were thinking about where they came from, they would have had an opportunity to return. <sup>16</sup> But they now desire a better place—a heavenly one. Therefore, God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them.

Luke 12:22-34

*Jesus assures us we have a Father in heaven who knows what we need better than we do.*

<sup>22</sup>Then he said to his disciples, “Therefore I tell you, don’t worry about your life, what you will eat; or about the body, what you will wear. <sup>23</sup>For life is more than food and the body more than clothing. <sup>24</sup>Consider the ravens: They don’t sow or reap; they don’t have a storeroom or a barn; yet God feeds them. Aren’t you worth much more than the birds? <sup>25</sup>Can any of you add one moment to his life span<sup>Ⓜ</sup> by worrying? <sup>26</sup>If then you’re not able to do even a little thing, why worry about the rest?

<sup>27</sup>“Consider how the wildflowers grow: They don’t labor or spin thread. Yet I tell you, not even Solomon in all his splendor was adorned like one of these. <sup>28</sup>If that’s how God clothes the grass, which is in the field today and is thrown into the furnace tomorrow, how much more will he do for you—you of little faith? <sup>29</sup>Don’t strive for what you should eat and what you should drink, and don’t be anxious. <sup>30</sup>For the Gentile world eagerly seeks all these things, and your Father knows that you need them.

<sup>31</sup>“But seek his kingdom, and these things will be provided for you. <sup>32</sup>Don’t be afraid, little flock, because your Father delights to give you the kingdom. <sup>33</sup>Sell your possessions and give to the poor. Make money-bags for yourselves that won’t grow old, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. <sup>34</sup>For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.
