GOD'S WORD FOR THIS WEEK

The Ascended Lord Jesus Is with Us Always in His Church on Earth Today we celebrate the Ascension of our Lord. Forty days after Jesus rose from the dead, he departed from his disciples and was enthroned in glory in heaven where he rules over all things as our Lord and King. Jesus's triumph guarantees that he will always keep his Word.

Forty days ago, the darkness of Lent was dispelled by the light of Easter. For forty days, the Church has cried, "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!" Our Easter joy is not diminished by Jesus' removing his visible presence from among us. Though his people here on earth no longer see him with our own eyes, Jesus is still with us; just as he promised not to leave his disciples alone but be with them always to the very end of the age. God continues to keep his promise to be present among his Church by pouring out his Holy Spirit on us through his Holy Gospel. He will continue to do this until he returns at the end to take us to be with him in heaven where we will share in his glory.

FIRST LESSON

Acts 1:1-11

The ascension of Jesus recalled by Luke.

I wrote the first narrative, Theophilus, about all that Jesus began to do and teach² until the day he was taken up, after he had given instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen.³ After he had suffered, he also presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them over a period of forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God.

⁴While he was^[a] with them, he commanded them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait for the Father's promise. "Which," he said, "you have heard me speak about; ⁵for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit in a few days."

⁶So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, are you restoring the kingdom to Israel at this time?"

⁷He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come on you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

⁹After he had said this, he was taken up as they were watching, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰While he was going, they were gazing into heaven, and suddenly two men in white clothes stood by them. ¹¹They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up into heaven? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come in the same way that you have seen him going into heaven."



Spirit^[b] of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of him. ¹⁸ I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened so that you may know what is the hope of his calling, what is the wealth of his glorious inheritance in the saints, ¹⁹ and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, according to the mighty working of his strength.
