

When the people of Israel wept, complaining that they had no meat to eat (Num. 11:4), Moses cried out to the Lord that "the burden of all this people" was too heavy for him and that he was "not able to carry all this people alone" (Num. 11:11–14). So the Lord had Moses gather "seventy men of the elders of Israel" (Num. 11:16), and the Lord "took some of the Spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders" (Num. 11:25), so that Moses would not carry the burden alone. All who thus labor are honored, and all the people are cared for, in the name of the Lord (Mark 9:39–41). Everything is done with reference to Christ Jesus. So we cling to Him, and we flee from all sins that would separate us from Him (Mark 9:42–48). The life of the Church is one of repentant faith in Christ. Christians confess their sins to one another, and they "pray for one another," that each would be raised up and healed by the Lord Jesus, who covers "a multitude of sins" and saves our souls from death (James 5:15–20).

#### FIRST LESSON

### Numbers 11:4-6, 10-16, 24-29

Beware of jealousy! Jealousy can rear its ugly head not only in romantic relationships and the things of others but also in the practice of our faith. It can happen between preachers of the Word, or among elders of the congregation in the exercise of their duties. Moses is clear that we should pray for everyone to be blessed with the Spirit and share the truth with others.

<sup>4</sup>The riffraff<sup>[a]</sup> among them had a strong craving for other food. The Israelites wept again and said, "Who will feed us meat? <sup>5</sup>We remember the free fish we ate in Egypt, along with the cucumbers, melons, leeks, onions, and garlic. <sup>6</sup>But now our appetite is gone;<sup>[b]</sup> there's nothing to look at but this manna!"

<sup>10</sup> Moses heard the people, family after family, weeping at the entrance of their tents. The LORD was very angry; Moses was also provoked.<sup>[a] 11</sup> So Moses asked the LORD, "Why have you brought such trouble on your servant? Why are you angry with me,<sup>[b]</sup> and why do you burden me with all these people? <sup>12</sup> Did I conceive all these people? Did I give them birth so you should tell me, 'Carry them at your breast, as a nursing mother carries a baby,' to the land that you swore to give their ancestors? <sup>13</sup> Where can I get meat to give all these people? For they are weeping to me, 'Give us meat to eat!' <sup>14</sup> I can't carry all these people by myself. They are too much for me. <sup>15</sup> If you are going to treat me like this, please kill me right now if I have found favor with you, and don't let me see my misery<sup>[c]</sup> anymore."

<sup>16</sup> The LORD answered Moses, "Bring me seventy men from Israel known to you as elders and officers of the people. Take them to the tent of meeting and have them stand there with you.

<sup>24</sup> Moses went out and told the people the words of the LORD. He brought seventy men from the elders of the people and had them stand around the tent. <sup>25</sup> Then the LORD descended in the cloud and spoke to him. He took some of the Spirit who was on Moses and placed the Spirit on the seventy elders. As the Spirit rested on them, they prophesied, but they never did it again. <sup>26</sup> Two men had remained in the camp, one named Eldad and the other Medad; the Spirit rested on them—they were among those listed, but had not gone out to the tent—and they prophesied in the camp. <sup>27</sup> A young man ran and reported to Moses, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp."

<sup>28</sup> Joshua son of Nun, assistant to Moses since his youth,<sup>[a]</sup> responded, "Moses, my lord, stop them!"

<sup>29</sup> But Moses asked him, "Are you jealous on my account? If only all the LORD's people were prophets and the LORD would place his Spirit on them!"

## PSALM OF THE DAY SECOND LESSON

Psalm 51b, p. 87

James 5:1-20

Marks of the Christian community include praying for those who are sick and in need, celebrating with those in good health, restoring those who have strayed, confessing sins to one another, and offering forgiveness to each other.

**5** Come now, you rich people, weep and wail over the miseries that are coming on you. <sup>2</sup>Your wealth has rotted and your clothes are moth-eaten. <sup>3</sup>Your gold and silver are corroded, and their corrosion will be a witness against you and will eat your flesh like fire. You have stored up treasure in the last days. <sup>4</sup>Look! The pay that you withheld from the workers who mowed your fields cries out, and the outcry of the harvesters has reached the ears of the Lord of Armies. <sup>5</sup>You have lived luxuriously on the earth and have indulged yourselves. You have fattened your hearts in a day of slaughter. <sup>6</sup>You have condemned, you have murdered the righteous, who does not resist you.

<sup>7</sup>Therefore, brothers and sisters, be patient until the Lord's coming. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth and is patient with it until it receives the early and the late rains. <sup>8</sup>You also must be patient. Strengthen your hearts, because the Lord's coming is near.

<sup>9</sup>Brothers and sisters, do not complain about one another, so that you will not be judged. Look, the judge stands at the door!

<sup>10</sup> Brothers and sisters, take the prophets who spoke in the Lord's name as an example of suffering and patience. <sup>11</sup> See, we count as blessed those who have endured.<sup>[a]</sup> You have heard of Job's endurance and have seen the outcome that the Lord brought about—the Lord is compassionate and merciful.

<sup>12</sup> Above all, my brothers and sisters, do not swear, either by heaven or by earth or with any other oath. But let your "yes" mean "yes," and your "no" mean "no," so that you won't fall under judgment.<sup>[b]</sup>

<sup>13</sup> Is anyone among you suffering? He should pray. Is anyone cheerful? He should sing praises. <sup>14</sup> Is anyone among you sick? He should call for the elders of the church, and they are to pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. <sup>15</sup> The prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up; if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven. <sup>16</sup> Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is very powerful in its effect. <sup>17</sup> Elijah was a human being as we are, and he prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the land. <sup>18</sup> Then he prayed again, and the sky gave rain and the land produced its fruit.

<sup>19</sup> My brothers and sisters, if any among you strays from the truth, and someone turns him back, <sup>20</sup> let that person know that whoever turns a sinner from the error of his way will save his soul from death and cover a multitude of sins.

<sup>38</sup>John said to him, "Teacher, we saw someone<sup>11</sup> driving out demons in your name, and we tried to stop him because he wasn't following us."

<sup>39</sup> "Don't stop him," said Jesus, "because there is no one who will perform a miracle in my name who can soon afterward speak evil of me. <sup>40</sup> For whoever is not against us is for us. <sup>41</sup> And whoever gives you a cup of water to drink in my name, because you belong to Christ —truly I tell you, he will never lose his reward.

<sup>42</sup> "But whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to fall away —it would be better for him if a heavy millstone were hung around his neck and he were thrown into the sea.

<sup>43</sup> "And if your hand causes you to fall away, cut it off. It is better for you to enter life maimed than to have two hands and go to hell, the unquenchable fire.<sup>11</sup> <sup>45</sup> And if your foot causes you to fall away, cut it off. It is better for you to enter life lame thadn to have two feet and be thrown into hell.<sup>11</sup> <sup>47</sup> And if your eye causes you to fall away, gouge it out. It is better for you to enter the kingdom of God with one eye than to have two eyes and

be thrown into hell, <sup>48</sup> where **their worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched.**<sup>49</sup> For everyone will be salted with fire.<sup>40</sup> <sup>50</sup> Salt is good, but if the salt should lose its flavor, how can you season it? Have salt among yourselves, and be at peace with one another."






# PRAYER FOR GRACE
