


MORNING PRAISE





FIRST LESSON Job 38:4-18

God in mercy appears to Job but he doesn't answer any of his questions. God points out his love for all of his creation and that includes Job.

⁴Where were you when I established the earth?

Tell me, if you have [a] understanding.

⁵Who fixed its dimensions? Certainly you know!

Who stretched a measuring line across it?

⁶What supports its foundations?

Or who laid its cornerstone

⁷ while the morning stars sang together and all the sons of God shouted for joy?

⁸Who enclosed the sea behind doors when it burst from the womb,

⁹when I made the clouds its garment and total darkness its blanket, ^[b]

¹⁰when I determined its boundaries ^[c]

and put its bars and doors in place,

"when I declared, "You may come this far, but no farther; your proud waves stop here"?

¹² Have you ever in your life commanded the morning or assigned the dawn its place, ¹³ so it may seize the edges of the earth and shake the wicked out of it?

¹⁴The earth is changed as clay is by a seal; its hills stand out like the folds of a garment.

¹⁵Light^[d] is withheld from the wicked, and the arm raised in violence is broken.

¹⁶ Have you traveled to the sources of the sea or walked in the depths of the oceans? ¹⁷ Have the gates of death been revealed to you? Have you seen the gates of deep darkness? ¹⁸ Have you comprehended the extent of the earth? Tell me, if you know all this.

SECOND LESSON

Romans 10:5-17

God comes down and brings a word of peace. It's not through your effort that you are saved but by his promise.

⁵ since Moses writes about the righteousness that is from the law: **The one who does these things will live by them.** ^{[a] 6} But the righteousness that comes from faith speaks like this: **Do not say in your heart, "Who will go up to heaven?"** ^[b] that is, to bring Christ down ⁷ or, "**Who will go down into the abyss?"** ^[c] that is, to bring Christ up from the dead. ⁸ On the contrary, what does it say? **The message is near you, in your mouth and in your heart.** ^[d] This is the message of faith that we proclaim: ⁹ If you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised

him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ One believes with the heart, resulting in righteousness, and one confesses with the mouth, resulting in salvation. ¹¹ For the Scripture says, **Everyone who believes on him will not be put to shame,** ^[c] ¹² since there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, because the same Lord of all richly blesses all who call on him. ¹³ For **everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.** ^[f]

¹⁴ How, then, can they call on him they have not believed in? And how can they believe without hearing about him? And how can they hear without a preacher? ¹⁵ And how can they preach unless they are sent? As it is written: **How beautiful** are the feet of those who bring good news. ^[h] ¹⁶ But not all obeyed the gospel. For Isaiah says, **Lord, who has believed our message?** ^[i] ¹⁷ So faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the message about Christ. ^[i]

VERSE OF THE DAY

Hebrews 11:1

Alleluia. Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see. Alleluia.

THE GOSPEL Matthew 14:22-33

The disciples are terrified not at the waves, not at the wind, but at the sight of Jesus walking on the water. God's power is on display and Jesus saves.

²² Immediately he^[a] made the disciples get into the boat and go ahead of him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. ²³ After dismissing the crowds, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. Well into the night, he was there alone. ²⁴ Meanwhile, the boat was already some distance^[b] from land,^[c] battered by the waves, because the wind was against them. ²⁵ Jesus came toward them walking on the sea very early in the morning. ^[d] ²⁶ When the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified. "It's a ghost!" they said, and they cried out in fear.

²⁷ Immediately Jesus spoke to them. "Have courage! It is I. Don't be afraid."


²⁸ "Lord, if it's you," Peter answered him, "command me to come to you on the water."

²⁹ He said, "Come."

And climbing out of the boat, Peter started walking on the water and came toward Jesus. ³⁰ But when he saw the strength of the wind, ^[c] he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, "Lord, save me!"

³¹Immediately Jesus reached out his hand, caught hold of him, and said to him, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?"

³²When they got into the boat, the wind ceased. ³³Then those in the boat worshiped him and said, "Truly you are the Son of God."





- Verse 2: Creator of all things, We praise you, we praise you!


 O Jesus Christ, the Son of God, We praise you, we praise you!

LORD'S PRAYER

M: O Lord, you have taught us to pray.

M: Father, you provide generously for your children. Give us today all that material blessings we need to serve you in the manner you desire, and make us grateful for all we receive. I pray this especially for Christians distressed by need, wherever they may be.

C: Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us;

M: Do not hold our sins against us. Use the gospel of Jesus to bring home to us the joy of your forgiveness, and enable us to stand before you fearlessly on the Last Day. I pray this as one who has learned from you, Father, how to forgive, and I strive to prove myself your child in this way.

C: Lead us not into temptation,

M: Keep your promise and be true to yourself, Father, by not doing anything that would cause us to sin. Do not abandon us in temptation, and do not let any temptation beyond our strength befall us, but send us your Spirit to defend us in every temptation. I pray this for myself and all your children.

C: But deliver us from evil.

M: Father, rescue me and all your saints in the church militant from evil. Protect us when we are tempted, assure us of your love, and transform everything that seems to harm us into blessing. Bring us all to glory, where we will worship you, our all in all. I pray this in the name of the One who taught us this prayer, Jesus Christ, your Son.

C: For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever.






PRAYER FOR GRACE

C: Amen






