SERVICE OF WORD

The Service of the Word

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PRAYER OF THE DAY

M: Let us pray.

O God, You are the strength of all who trust in You, and without Your aid we can do no good thing. Grant us the help of Your grace that we may please You in both will and deed; The **Collect** (also known as the "Prayer of the Day") is a concise prayer which "collects" the thoughts of the day and presents them to God in his mercy. Many of these prayers have been in use in the church for more than 1,500 years. through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

FIRST LESSON

Like the Gospel reading, both are only concerned with eating and drinking. Amos rails against the sins of the rich and powerful. They have grown comfortable while neglecting God's Word as well as the suffering of others. May we remember and help those who are hurting.

6 Woe to those who are at ease in Zion and to those who feel secure on the hill of Samaria the notable people in this first of the nations, those the house of Israel comes to. ² Cross over to Calneh and see; go from there to great Hamath; then go down to Gath of the Philistines. Are you better than these kingdoms? Is their territory larger than yours? ³ You dismiss any thought of the evil day and bring in a reign of violence.

⁴They lie on beds inlaid with ivory, sprawled out on their couches, and dine on lambs from the flock and calves from the stall.
⁵They improvise songs^[a] to the sound of the harp and invent^[b] their own musical instruments like David.
⁶They drink wine by the bowlful and anoint themselves with the finest oils but do not grieve over the ruin of Joseph.
⁷Therefore, they will now go into exile as the first of the captives, and the feasting of those who sprawl out will come to an end.

PSALM OF THE DAY SECOND LESSON

Psalm 146 1 Timothy 3:1-16

Overseers and deacons are caretakers of God's Word and this requires faithful service. They should not change the word of God to fit culture or to comfort the rich with what they want to hear. They are to speak faithfully.

Amos 6:1-7

3 This saying is trustworthy: "If anyone aspires to be an overseer,^[a] he desires a noble work." ² An overseer, therefore, must be above reproach, the husband of one wife, self-controlled, sensible, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, ³ not an excessive drinker, not a bully but gentle, not quarrelsome, not greedy. ⁴ He must manage his own household competently and have his children under control with all dignity. ⁵ (If anyone does not know how to manage his own household, how will he take care of God's church?) ⁶ He must not be a new convert, or he might become conceited and incur the same condemnation as the devil. ⁷ Furthermore, he must have a good reputation among outsiders, so that he does not fall into disgrace and the devil's trap.

⁸Deacons, likewise, should be worthy of respect, not hypocritical, not drinking a lot of wine, not greedy for money, ⁹ holding the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. ¹⁰ They must also be tested first; if they prove blameless, then they can serve as deacons. ¹¹ Wives, ^[b] likewise, should be worthy of respect, not slanderers, selfcontrolled, faithful in everything. ¹² Deacons are to be husbands of one wife, managing their children and their own households competently. ¹³ For those who have served well as deacons acquire a good standing for themselves and great boldness in the faith that is in Christ Jesus.

¹⁴ I write these things to you, hoping to come to you soon. ¹⁵ But if I should be delayed, I have written so that you will know how people ought to conduct themselves in God's household, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and foundation of the truth. ¹⁶ And most certainly, the mystery of godliness is great:

He^[C] was manifested in the flesh, vindicated in the Spirit, seen by angels, preached among the nations, believed on in the world, taken up in glory.

VERSE OF THE DAY

Philippians 2:10,11

Alleluia. At the name of Jesus every knee should bow, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. Alleluia.



Jesus tells us a parable about two men, one whose confidence was in his wealth, another whose confidence was in his God.

¹⁹ "There was a rich man who would dress in purple and fine linen, feasting lavishly every day. ²⁰ But a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, was lying at his gate. ²¹ He longed to be filled with what fell from the rich man's table, but instead the dogs would come and lick his sores. ²² One day the poor man died and was carried away by the angels to Abraham's side.^[a] The rich man also died and was buried. ²³ And being in torment in Hades, he looked up and saw Abraham a long way off, with Lazarus at his side. ²⁴ 'Father Abraham!' he called out, 'Have mercy on me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, because I am in agony in this flame!'

²⁵ "Son,"^[b] Abraham said, 'remember that during your life you received your good things, just as Lazarus received bad things, but now he is comforted here, while you are in agony. ²⁶ Besides all this, a great chasm has been fixed between us and you, so that those who want to pass over from here to you cannot; neither can those from there cross over to us.'

²⁷ "Father,' he said, 'then I beg you to send him to my father's house— ²⁸ because I have five brothers—to warn them, so that they won't also come to this place of torment.'

²⁹ "But Abraham said, "They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them."

³⁰ "No, father Abraham,' he said. 'But if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.'

³¹ "But he told him, 'If they don't listen to Moses and the prophets, they will not be persuaded if someone rises from the dead.""
