

*The **Collect** (also known as the "Prayer of the Day") is a concise prayer which "collects" the thoughts of the day and presents them to God in his mercy. Many of these prayers have been in use in the church for more than 1,500 years.*

FIRST LESSON

Deuteronomy 11:18-21, 26-28

The Word is to be an essential part of life not a decoration that hangs on the wall. Apply these words to your heart and life.

¹⁸ "Imprint these words of mine on your hearts and minds, bind them as a sign on your hands, and let them be a symbol^[a] on your foreheads.^[b] ¹⁹ Teach them to your children, talking about them when you sit in your house and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. ²⁰ Write them on the doorposts of your house and on your city gates, ²¹ so that as long as the heavens are above the earth, your days and those of your children may be many in the land the LORD swore to give your ancestors.

²⁶ "Look, today I set before you a blessing and a curse: ²⁷ there will be a blessing, if you obey the commands of the LORD your God I am giving you today, ²⁸ and a curse, if you do not obey the commands of the LORD your God and you turn aside from the path I command you today by following other gods you have not known.

SECOND LESSON

Romans 3:21-28

Only through Christ's cross could God be both just and justifier. Only through Christ's cross could we be justified by faith. That is the truth anything else added to it is not.

²¹ But now, apart from the law, the righteousness of God has been revealed, attested by the Law and the Prophets.^[a] ²² The righteousness of God is through faith in Jesus Christ^[b] to all who believe, since there is no distinction. ²³ For all have sinned and fall short of the^[c] glory of God; ²⁴ they are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus. ²⁵ God presented him as the mercy seat^[d] by his blood, through faith, to demonstrate his righteousness, because in his restraint God passed over the sins previously committed. ²⁶ God presented him to demonstrate his righteousness at the present time, so that he would be just and justify the one who has faith in Jesus.

²⁷ Where, then, is boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law?^[e] By one of works? No, on the contrary, by a law^[f] of faith. ²⁸ For we conclude that a person is justified by faith apart from the works of the law.

VERSE OF THE DAY

Psalm 119:105

Alleluia. Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path. Alleluia.

THE GOSPEL

Matthew 7:15-29

Jesus prepares his disciples to go out as sheep among wolves. How can we be safe? Look at the fruit of a prophet. Look at what they say and compare to Scripture.

¹⁵ “Be on your guard against false prophets who come to you in sheep’s clothing but inwardly are ravaging wolves. ¹⁶ You’ll recognize them by their fruit. Are grapes gathered from thornbushes or figs from thistles? ¹⁷ In the same way, every good tree produces good fruit, but a bad tree produces bad fruit. ¹⁸ A good tree can’t produce bad fruit; neither can a bad tree produce good fruit. ¹⁹ Every tree that doesn’t produce good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. ²⁰ So you’ll recognize them by their fruit.

²¹ “Not everyone who says to me, ‘Lord, Lord,’ will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father in heaven. ²² On that day many will say to me, ‘Lord, Lord, didn’t we prophesy in your name, drive out demons in your name, and do many miracles in your name?’ ²³ Then I will announce to them, ‘I never knew you. **Depart from me, you lawbreakers!**’^{[a][b]}

²⁴ “Therefore, everyone who hears these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. ²⁵ The rain fell, the rivers rose, and the winds blew and pounded that house. Yet it didn’t collapse, because its foundation was

on the rock. ²⁶ But everyone who hears these words of mine and doesn't act on them will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. ²⁷ The rain fell, the rivers rose, the winds blew and pounded that house, and it collapsed. It collapsed with a great crash."

²⁸ When Jesus had finished saying these things, the crowds were astonished at his teaching, ²⁹ because he was teaching them like one who had authority, and not like their scribes.




