# WELCOME TO WORSHIP



- C: Amen.


# The Service of the Word

M: Let us pray.


O Lord, your ears are always open to the prayers of your humble servants, who come to you in Jesus' name. Teach us always to ask according to your will that we may never fail to obtain the blessings you have promised; through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. The **Collect** (also known as the "Prayer of the Day") is a concise prayer which "collects" the thoughts of the day and presents them to God in his mercy. Many of these prayers have been in use in the church for more than 1,500 years.




#### Moses reminds God's people why they were chosen. It was because of God's love.

<sup>6</sup>For you are a holy people belonging to the LORD your God. The LORD your God has chosen you to be his own possession out of all the peoples on the face of the earth.

<sup>7</sup> "The LORD had his heart set on you and chose you, not because you were more numerous than all peoples, for you were the fewest of all peoples. <sup>8</sup> But because the LORD loved you and kept the oath he swore to your ancestors, he brought you out with a strong hand and redeemed you from the place of slavery, from the power of Pharaoh king of Egypt. <sup>9</sup> Know that the LORD your God is God, the faithful God who keeps his gracious covenant loyalty for a thousand generations with those who love him and keep his commands.

#### SECOND LESSON

<sup>28</sup>We know that all things work together<sup>a</sup> for the good<sup>b</sup> of those who love God, who are called according to his purpose.<sup>29</sup> For those he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, so that he would be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters. <sup>30</sup> And those he predestined, he also called; and those he called, he also justified; and those he justified, he also glorified.

<sup>31</sup>What, then, are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? <sup>32</sup> He did not even spare his own Son but gave him up for us all. How will he not also with him grant us everything? <sup>33</sup>Who can bring an accusation against God's elect? God is the one who justifies. <sup>34</sup> Who is the one who condemns? Christ Jesus is the one who died, but even more, has been raised; he also is at the right hand of God and intercedes for us. <sup>35</sup>Who can separate us from the love of Christ? Can affliction or distress or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? <sup>36</sup> As it is written:

#### Because of you

#### we are being put to death all day long;

#### we are counted as sheep to be slaughtered.

<sup>37</sup>No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. <sup>38</sup> For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, <sup>39</sup> nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.
