WORSHIP THEME

The mustard seed becomes a great shrub that shelters the birds, recalling ancient images of the tree of life. We'd expect a cedar or a sequoia, but Jesus finds the power of God better imaged in a tiny, no-account seed. It's not the way we expect divine activity to look. Yet the tree of life is here, in the cross around which we gather, the tree into which we are grafted through baptism, the true vine that nourishes us with its fruit in the cup we share. It may not appear all that impressive, but while nobody's looking it grows with a power beyond our understanding.

The work of the gospel is invisible, but real. It is hidden, but with results that can be seen—even if the power behind those visible results remains a mystery. Faith that is the result of the living seed of the Word is alive and gives evidence of its life.

- M: God, our Father, has taken away all your sins. By the perfect life and innocent death of our Lord Jesus Christ, who ran the race before us and leads the way, he has removed yoru guilt forever. You are his own dear child. May God give you strength to live according to his will.

- M: We rejoice as Jesus leads the way to the finish line. With him we win. We are champions in Jesus and one day we will live with him in heaven.

The Collect (also known as the "Prayer of the Day") is a concise prayer which "collects" the thoughts of the day and presents them to God in his mercy. Many of these prayers have been in use in the church for more than 1,500 years.

FIRST LESSON Ezekiel 17:22-24


God speaks how he will choose someone from Judah's royal family (the cedar tree) to reign over all creation. But God didn't choose this one from Judah when they were champions. No, this message came to God's people when they were at a low point in life. This is when their power was waning, the kingdom divided, and they were in exile.

²² "This is what the Lord GOD says:

I will take a sprig from the lofty top of the cedar and plant it. I will pluck a tender sprig from its topmost shoots, and I will plant it on a high towering mountain. ²³ I will plant it on Israel's high mountain so that it may bear branches, produce fruit, and become a majestic cedar. Birds of every kind will nest under it, taking shelter in the shade of its branches. ²⁴Then all the trees of the field will know that I am the LORD. I bring down the tall tree, and make the low tree tall. I cause the green tree to wither and make the withered tree thrive. I, the LORD, have spoken and I will do it.""

SECOND LESSON

2 Corinthians 5:1-10

Paul encourages believers to live by faith and not by sight. We do not consider Jesus from a human perspective but through the eyes of faith, believing he died for all and was raised. All who are in Christ are now in God's new creation.


5 For we know that if our earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal dwelling in the heavens, not made with hands. ² Indeed, we groan in this tent, desiring to put on our heavenly dwelling, ³ since, when we are clothed, ^[a] we will not be found naked. ⁴ Indeed, we groan while we are in this tent, burdened as we are, because we do not want to be unclothed but clothed, so that mortality may be swallowed up by life. ⁵ Now the one who prepared us for this very purpose is God, who gave us the Spirit as a down payment.

⁶ So we are always confident and know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord. ⁷ For we walk by faith, not by sight. ⁸ In fact, we are confident, and we would prefer to be away from the body and at home with the Lord. ⁹ Therefore, whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to be pleasing to him. ¹⁰ For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each may be repaid for what he has done in the body, whether good or evil.

Psalm 132:9

THE GOSPEL Mark 4:26-34

Jesus uses the image of sowing and growing to demonstrate the power of God's kingdom. It's at work and growing even when you can't see it.

⁶ "The kingdom of God is like this," he said. "A man scatters seed on the ground. ²⁷ He sleeps and rises night and day; the seed sprouts and grows, although he doesn't know how. ²⁸ The soil produces a crop by itself—first the blade, then the head, and then the full grain on the head. ²⁹ As soon as the crop is ready, he sends for the sickle, because the harvest has come."

³⁰ And he said, "With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use to describe it? ³¹ It's like a mustard seed that, when sown upon the soil, is the smallest of all the seeds on the ground. ³² And when sown, it comes up and grows taller than all the garden plants, and produces large branches, so that the birds of the sky can nest in its shade."


³³ He was speaking the word to them with many parables like these, as they were able to understand. ³⁴ He did not speak to them without a parable. Privately, however, he explained everything to his own disciples.

Thy kingdom come.


Thy will be done,

THE BLESSING


