WORSHIP THEME

Today is called "PALM AND PASSION SUNDAY." It reminds us not only of the triumphal entry of Jesus Christ into Jerusalem on that first Palm Sunday long ago when He was heralded as the true King, but it also reminds us of how quickly things changed. It reminds us of His imminent rejection, suffering and crucifixion as His kingship was so terribly misunderstood.

SERVICE OF WORD

Lent began with an almost equal focus on the sinner and the Savior. Now in Holy Week, the focus is on Christ. The readings for today want us to understand once and for all who has come to save us so that with all confidence we may follow him.

For those who wish to join the processional we will begin the service from the entryway. The presider will introduce the service.

INVOCATION

M: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

C: And also with you

ENTRANCE RITE FOR PALM SUNDAY

M: For the five weeks of Lent we have been preparing for the celebration of our Lord's paschal mystery. Today we come together to begin the solemn celebration of Holy Week. Christ entered in triumph into his own city to complete his work as our Messiah: to suffer, to die, and to rise again. Remember with devotion his entry that

culminated at the empty tomb and follow him in faith. United with him in Baptism, we share in his resurrection and new life.

M: Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!

C: Hosanna to the Son of David! PRAYER

M: Let us pray.

God our Father, we remember how Jesus entered Jerusalem before his passion and was welcomed as king by those who shouted, "Hosanna", and spread their cloaks and palm branches in his path. Accept our words of praise and listen to our prayers as we rejoice in our triumphant King who entered Jerusalem to save us; even your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

C: Amen.

THE GOSPEL

Luke 19:28-40

Jesus certainly is making a statement by riding a donkey. He's claiming to be that the conqueror that Zechariah prophesied. He brings a rule of peace.

²⁸When he had said these things, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. ²⁹As he approached Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples ³⁰ and said, "Go into the village ahead of you. As you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it. ³¹If anyone asks you, "Why are you untying it?" say this: "The Lord needs it."

³² So those who were sent left and found it just as he had told them. ³³ As they were untying the colt, its owners said to them, "Why are you untying the colt?"

³⁴ "The Lord needs it," they said. ³⁵ Then they brought it to Jesus, and after throwing their clothes on the colt, they helped Jesus get on it. ³⁶ As he was going along, they were spreading their clothes on the road. ³⁷ Now he came near the path down the Mount of Olives, and the whole crowd of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the miracles they had seen:

³⁸ Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord.^[a]

The Service of the Word

Having just received absolution for their sins, believers now gather around the Word of God to find encouragement and peace for their lives on earth.

FIRST LESSON

Zechariah 9:9, 10

Jesus is the King of kings. When a king came on a donkey it was because his enemies had been defeated and he had nothing to fear. The enemy has already lost and Jesus proclaims peace. His kingdom extends rules from the river to the ends of the earth.

⁹Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion! Shout in triumph, Daughter Jerusalem! Look, your King is coming to you; he is righteous and victorious,^[b] humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. ¹⁰ I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the horse from Jerusalem. The bow of war will be removed, and he will proclaim peace to the nations. His dominion will extend from sea to sea, from the Euphrates River to the ends of the earth.

PSALM OF THE DAY

SECOND LESSON

Psalm 24 Philippians 2:5-11

Jesus, our Savior, is Lord of all. He did not display his glory while on earth, instead, he became our humble substitute and died to save us. Here Paul calls us to have the same mindset of Christ Jesus: humility, love, sacrifice.

⁵Adopt the same attitude as that of Christ Jesus, ⁶who, existing in the form of God, did not consider equality with God as something to be exploited.^[a] ⁷Instead he emptied himself by assuming the form of a servant, taking on the likeness of humanity. And when he had come as a man, ⁸ he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of deatheven to death on a cross. ⁹For this reason God highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee will bowin heaven and on earth and under the earth-¹¹ and every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Grant success to the businesses and industries of our land to serve for the common good. Cause all employers to be honest and fair-minded and all employees to be diligent and faithful.
- C: Look with favor on our nation's schools. Be with those who teach and those who learn. Comfort the sick and the afflicted with the assurance of your care and protection. Strengthen the faith of the dying.

Each stanza places the words, "Behold, Behold your King," on quite different lips: the humility of Palm Sunday (st. 1), our Lord's Passion (st. 2,3), and the genuine victory procession of our Lord's Resurrection (st. 4).
